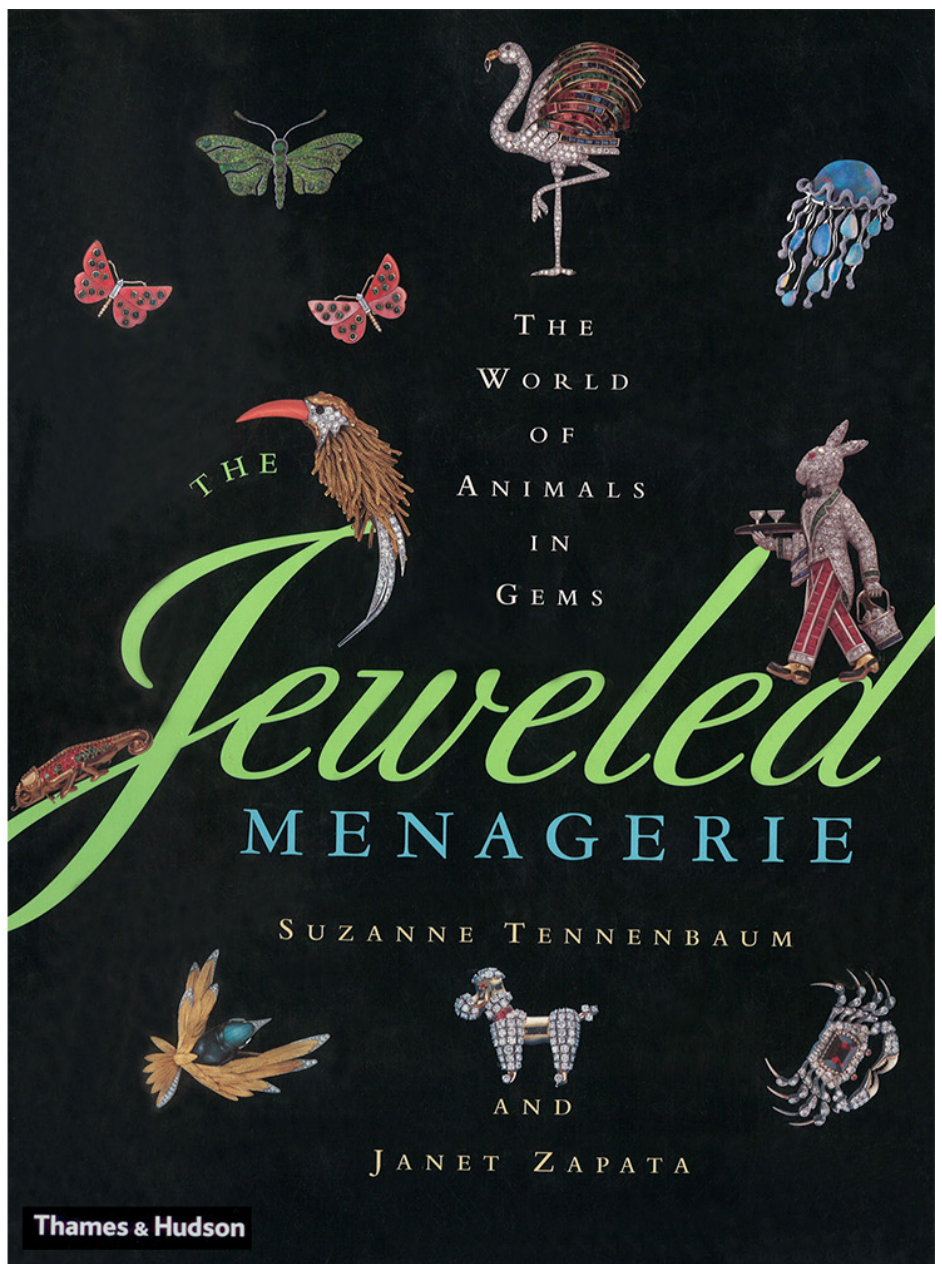

The year 2000 was an exciting one for jewelry based on marine life, as talented jewelers on both sides of the Atlantic contributed outstanding designs. In Paris, the house of Mauboussin created a fish with an agate, accented with diamonds, and a squiggly jellyfish with opals, diamonds and enamel. In New York, Christopher Walling designed his first piece of jewelry from the animal kingdom, a fish with white and brown diamonds and grayish pink abalone pearls, the latter a trademark of his work.
